Section 1. Article 3 of Chapter 58 of the General Statutes is amended by adding the following new section to read:

## "§ 58-3-170.1. Provider-patient communications not restricted.

- (a) A health benefit plan shall not limit a participating provider's ability to discuss with an enrollee the clinical treatment options available to the enrollee, the risks associated with the treatment, or a recommended course of treatment.
- (b) As used in this section, the term 'health benefit plan' means any accident and health insurance policy or certificate; nonprofit hospital or medical service corporation contract; health, hospital, or medical service corporation plan contract; HMO subscriber contract; and any plan provided by a multiple employer welfare arrangement (MEWA) or any plan provided by other benefit arrangements, to the extent permitted by ERISA."

Section 2. This act is effective when it becomes law and applies to health benefit plan contracts issued, amended, or renewed on and after that date.
