6	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
7	Section 1. (a) There is appropriated from the General Fund to the State Board
8	of Education the sum of five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000) for the 1997-98 fiscal
9	year and the sum of five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000) for the 1998-99 fiscal year
10	to establish a public-private partnership to encourage, promote, and expand technology in
11	North Carolina Public Schools.
12	(b) The purposes of the public-private partnership are to enlist public, private, and
13	volunteer sectors to develop creative means of bringing technology to North Carolina
14	Public School classrooms at minimal cost and expense to the State and its taxpayers:
15	(1) Help schools wire classrooms with high speed data wire that enables
16	them to connect to school networks as well as the Internet.

The Information Resources Management Commission shall submit the evaluation 9 done by ExplorNet and the Commission's comments on it to the State Board of Education by August 15, 1999. 10 The State Board of Education shall report the results of these evaluations to the 11 12 Joint Legislative Education Oversight Committee by September 15, 1999. 13 Section 2. This act becomes effective July 1, 1997.

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
