2	AN ACT TO ESTABLISH THE LOCKSMITH LICENSING ACT.
3	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
4	Section 1. The General Statutes are amended by adding a new Chapter to read:

6	<b>''LOCKSMITH LICENSING ACT.</b>
7	" <u>§ 74F-1. Short title.</u>
8	This act shall be known as the North Carolina Locksmith Licensing Act.
9	" <u>§ 74F-2. Purpose.</u>
10	Locksmiths have the knowledge and tools to bypass or neutralize security devices in
11	vehicles, homes, and businesses. The laws of this State do not protect citizens from the
12	unscrupulous use and abuse of this knowledge and these tools by persons who are
13	untrained or have criminal intent. Therefore, the licensing of locksmiths is necessary to
14	protect public health, safety, and welfare.
