3	TEACHERS' AND STATE EMPLOYEES' COMPREHENSIVE MAJOR MEDICAL
4	PLAN FOR FILING FRAUDULENT CLAIMS TO BE REINSTATED IN THE
5	PLAN.
6	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
7	Section 1. G.S. 135-40.2(h) reads as rewritten:
8	"(h) No person shall be eligible for coverage as an employee or retired employee or
9	as a dependent of an employee or retired employee upon a finding by the Executive
10	Administrator or Board of Trustees or by a court of competent jurisdiction that the
11	employee or dependent knowingly and willfully made or caused to be made a false
12	statement or false representation of a material fact in a claim for reimbursement of
13	medical services under the Plan. Persons subject to this subsection shall have a cessation
14	of coverage for a period of five years and are eligible for benefits after the five-year
15	period upon a full and complete restitution to the Plan for all fraudulent claim amounts."
16	Section 2. G.S. 135-40.11(a)(6) reads as rewritten:
17	"(6) The last day of the month in which a covered individual is found to have
18	knowingly and willfully made or caused to be made a false statement or
19	false representation of a material fact in a claim for reimbursement of
20	medical services under the Plan. Persons subject to this subdivision

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1	shall have a cessation of coverage for a period of five years and are
2	eligible for benefits after the five-year period upon a full and complete
3	restitution to the Plan for all fraudulent claim amounts."
4	Section 3. This act is effective when it becomes law.
