A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
AN ACT TO REQUIRE THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION AND THE
DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES TO STUDY THE
SCHOOL LUNCH, SCHOOL BREAKFAST, AND SUMMER FOOD SERVICE
PROGRAMS AND TO MODIFY IMPLEMENTATION OF THOSE PROGRAMS
AS ALLOWED UNDER CURRENT LAW; AND TO REQUIRE THE
DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES TO STUDY THE FOOD
STAMPS PROGRAM AND TO MODIFY IMPLEMENTATION OF THAT
PROGRAM AS ALLOWED UNDER CURRENT LAW.
The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
Section 1. The Department of Health and Human Services and the Department
of Public Instruction, in conjunction with the Department of Agriculture and Consumer
Services, the statewide system of food banks, the North Carolina Hunger Network, the
North Carolina Nutrition Network, and other State and local agencies, shall study the
School Lunch Program, the School Breakfast Program, and the Summer Food Service
Program. This study shall specifically include a study of the reasons for underutilization
of the programs. The Department of Public Instruction and the Department of Health and
Human Services shall take any actions authorized under current law to increase
participation in these programs before the beginning of the 2000-2001 school year. The

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1	Department of	Health and Human Services and the Department of Public Instruction shall	
2	report on any actions taken under this section and shall make any recommendations on		
3	changes to current law to the Joint Legislative Public Assistance Commission by October		
4	1, 2000.		
5	Secti	on 2. The Department of Health and Human Services, in conjunction with	
6	the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services, the statewide system of food		
7	banks, the North Carolina Hunger Network, the North Carolina Nutrition Network, and		
8	other State and local agencies, shall conduct a comprehensive study of the Food Stamps		
9	Program, specifically focusing on reasons for the underutilization of the program. This		
10	study shall include inquiry into the following areas:		
11	(1)	The feasibility of additional outreach efforts to inform the public of the	
12		requirements and availability of food stamps.	
13	(2)	The feasibility of extended business hours for local departments of	
14		social services to facilitate the process of obtaining food stamps.	
15	(3)	The feasibility of ending automatic termination of food stamps when the	
16		individual or family no longer receives Work First cash assistance;	
17		thereby providing a transition period while the family moves toward	
18		economic independence.	
19		Department shall identify any actions which may be taken under current	
20	law to increase participation in the Food Stamps Program and implement those actions as		
21	soon as practicable. The Department shall report on efforts under this section to the Joint		
22	Legislative Pub	lic Assistance Commission by October 1, 2000.	

23 Section 3. This act is effective when it becomes law.
