A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT TO EXTEND THE AUTHORITY OF THE JOINT SELECT COMMITTEE
2 ON INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY TO STUDY AND REPORT ON THE
3 TECHNOLOGICAL INFRASTRUCTURE OF THE DEPARTMENT OF THE
4 SECRETARY OF STATE AND THE DEPARTMENT OF THE STATE
5 TREASURER.

7 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

8 Section 1. Section 22.2. of S.L. 1999-237 reads as rewritten:

9 "Section 22.2. The Joint Select Committee on Information Technology, established
10 pursuant to Section 22 of this act, shall study, evaluate, and recommend changes in the
11 current technological infrastructure of the Department of the Secretary of State and the
12 Department of the State Treasurer. The Committee shall:

- 13 (1) Consider the feasibility and advisability of moving the
14 Secretary of State's applications from the ITS mainframe to in-
15 house servers and allowing the Secretary of State to develop and
16 support its own computer applications;
17 (2) Consider the need to replace, update, or modify the mainframe
18 system within the Department of the State Treasurer and existing
19 banking system which supports the State Treasurer's Banking
20 Operations Division; and

1 (3) Study, evaluate, and recommend the level of audit staff needed
2 in the Office of the State Auditor to provide for adequate audit
3 coverage of the computer applications and installation in State
4 government.

5 The Committee shall report by ~~April 1, 2000,~~ December 1, 2000, to the
6 Appropriations Committees of the Senate and House of Representatives."

7 Section 2. This act is effective when it becomes law.
