A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO DIRECT THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES

TO ALLOCATE MEDICAID FUNDS FOR THE 2000-2001 FISCAL YEAR FOR

CERTAIN MENTAL HEALTH PURPOSES, AND TO CONDUCT OTHER

ACTIVITIES TO IMPROVE MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

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Section 1. The Department of Health and Human Services shall allocate Medicaid funds for the 2000-2001 fiscal year to:

- (1) Increase CAP MR/DD slots and CAP DA slots to serve additional Medicaid recipients eligible for these services, and
- (2) Expand residential services to provide mental health services to more Medicaid-eligible children.

Services shall ensure that local departments of social services and other local agencies conduct initial screenings and, if necessary, assessments of children in the custody and placement responsibility of local departments of social services to determine if the children are in need of mental health services. The Department shall adopt rules, including temporary rules, to ensure that screenings and assessments are conducted.
