2	AN ACT TO PROVIDE A MECHANISM FOR CITY AND TOWN FIRE
3	DEPARTMENTS TO RECEIVE FIREMEN'S RELIEF FUND MONEYS WHEN
4	THEIR PAYMENTS HAVE BEEN FORFEITED THROUGH NO FAULT OF
5	THEIR OWN.
6	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
7	Section 1. G.S. 58-84-45 reads as rewritten:
8	"§ 58-84-45. Municipal clerk to certify list of fire companies; effect of failure.
9	<u>failure; appeals.</u>
10	The clerk of any city, town, village, or other municipal corporation having-that has an
11	organized fire department shall, on or before the thirty-first day of October 31 in each year,
12	make and file with the Commissioner of Insurance his-the clerk's certificate, stating the
13	existence of such-the department, the number of steam, hand, or other engines, hook and
14	ladder trucks, and hose cars in actual use, the number of organized companies, and the
15	system or systems of water supply in use for such departments, the department, together
16	with such other facts as information that the Commissioner of Insurance may require, on a
17	blank to be furnished by him. requires. This information shall be on a form furnished by
18	the Commissioner. If the clerk fails to file the certificate required by this section is not
19	filed-with the Commissioner of Insurance-on or before October 31 in any year, the city,
20	town or village so failing to file such certificate city or town shall forfeit the payment next

due to be paid to said its board of trustees, and the trustees. The Commissioner of Insurance 1 2 shall pay over said the forfeited amount to the treasurer of the North Carolina State 3 Firemen's Association and same shall constitute a part of Association, who shall credit that 4 amount to the firemen's relief fund: Provided, that the Commissioner of Insurance is 5 authorized and empowered to pay over to the local board of trustees of the firemen's relief fund 6 for the benefit of the fire department of any city, town, village or other municipal corporation 7 having an organized fire department, which has otherwise complied with the provisions of 8 Articles 84 through 88 of this Chapter, the proper allocation or share of the funds derived under 9 the provisions of Articles 84 through 88 of this Chapter for the year 1953, and which funds up to 10 this time have been withheld because the clerk of such city, town, village or other municipal 11 corporation having an organized fire department failed to file the certificate required by this 12 section or failed to file same on or before October 31, 1953; the certificates filed subsequent to 13 October 31, 1953, shall be deemed to have been filed in substantial compliance with this section, 14 and as to those organized fire departments which have not yet filed any certificate for 1953, the 15 Commissioner of Insurance may pay to such department its proper share of the funds derived 16 under Articles 84 through 88 of this Chapter, upon the filing of such certificate for said year; all 17 other requirements of Articles 84 through 88 of this Chapter must have been complied with and 18 this proviso applies only to the funds of the year 1953. fund. 19 If the Commissioner fails to furnish the certificate form to the clerk, if the (b) certificate form is sent to the wrong party, or if the clerk does not receive the certificate 20 21 form for any reason that is not the fault of the clerk, city, or town, the city or town may 22 appeal to the Commissioner if any of these occurrences cause a forfeiture of the next payment to the city or town. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, if the 23 Commissioner determines that the city or town is entitled to payment, the Commissioner 24 may (i) order the Association to make the payment from the relief fund; or (ii) make the 25 payment to the city or town from the proceeds in G.S. 58-84-25." 26 27 Section 2. This act is effective when it becomes law and applies retroactively

28 to August 15, 1998.
