5	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
6	Section 1. G.S. 135-1(25) reads as rewritten:
7	"(25) "Teacher" shall mean any teacher, helping teacher, librarian, principal,
8	supervisor, superintendent of public schools or any full-time employee,
9	city or county, superintendent of public instruction, or any full-time
10	employee of Department of Public Instruction, president, dean or
11	teacher, or any full-time employee in any educational institution
12	supported by and under the control of the State: Provided, that-that,
13	except as otherwise provided in this subdivision, the term "teacher" shall
14	not include any part-time, temporary, or substitute teacher or employee,
15	and shall not include those participating in an optional retirement
16	program provided for in G.S. 135-5.1. In all cases of doubt, the Board of
17	Trustees, Trustees hereinafter defined, shall determine whether any person
18	is a teacher as defined in this Chapter. The term "teacher" includes
19	teachers who are employed to teach in permanent positions and who
20	work not less than fifty percent (50%) of the time that is required of a

1	person who is employed as a teacher, as that term is defined under the
2	provisions of G.S. 115C-325(6)."
3	Section 2. This act becomes effective July 1, 2000.
