1 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO PROVIDE THAT A NONRESIDENT IS ELIGIBLE TO BE CHARGED THE IN-STATE TUITION RATE IF THE NONRESIDENT IS ENROLLED AS A STUDENT AT A CONSTITUENT INSTITUTION OF THE UNIVERSITY OF NORTH CAROLINA AND THE NONRESIDENT'S DOMICILE IS WITHIN A ONE HUNDRED-MILE RADIUS OF THE UNC CAMPUS AT WHICH THE NONRESIDENT IS ENROLLED.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. G.S. 116-144 reads as rewritten:

"§ 116-144. Higher tuition to be charged nonresidents. nonresidents; exception.

(a) The Board of Governors shall fix the tuition and required fees charged nonresidents of North Carolina who attend the institutions enumerated in G.S. 116-4 at rates higher than the rates charged residents of North Carolina and comparable to the rates charged nonresident students by comparable public institutions nationwide, except that a person who serves as a graduate teaching assistant or graduate research assistant or in a similar instructional or research assignment and is at the same time enrolled as a graduate student in the same institution may, in the discretion of the Board of Governors, be charged a lower rate fixed by the Board, provided the rate is not lower than the North

- (b) Notwithstanding subsection (a) of this section, a person who is a nonresident shall be eligible to be charged the in-State tuition rate if: (i) the person enrolls as a student at any of the institutions enumerated in G.S. 116-4, (ii) the person is a resident of a state that borders North Carolina, and (iii) the person's domicile is located within a 100-mile radius of the institution at which the student is enrolled.
- (c) For purposes of this section, the following states are deemed to be border states of North Carolina:
- (1) Virginia.
