6	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:	
7	Secti	on 1. G.S. 115C-238.29I(c) reads as rewritten:
8	"(c) The	State Board of Education shall review and evaluate the educational
9	effectiveness of the charter school approach authorized under this Part and the effect of	
10	charter schools on the public schools in the local school administrative unit in which the	
11	charter schools	are located. The Board shall report no later than January 1, 2002, to the
12	Joint Legislative Education Oversight Committee with recommendations to modify,	
13	expand, or terminate that approach. The Board shall base its recommendations on the	
14	following information:	
15	<u>(1)</u>	The current and projected impact of charter schools on the delivery of
16		services by the public schools.
17	<u>(2)</u>	Student academic progress in the charter schools as measured, where
18		available, against the academic year immediately preceding the first
19		academic year of the charter schools' operation.
20	<u>(3)</u>	Best practices resulting from charter school operations.

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<u>Analysis of this information shall be the predominant factor in determining whether</u>
<u>the number of charter schools should be increased and the conditions under which any</u>
<u>increase or continued operation should occur. If the analysis indicates demonstrable,</u>
<u>substantial success, the General Assembly may consider expanding the number of charter</u>
<u>schools that may be established.</u>"
<u>Section 2. This act becomes effective July 1, 1999.</u>
