Section 3. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Judicial Department the sum of seventy-seven thousand seven hundred eighty-four dollars (\$77,784) for the 1999-2000 fiscal year and the sum of one hundred forty-nine thousand four hundred forty-six dollars (\$149,446) for the 2000-2001 fiscal year to establish the two assistant district attorney positions provided for in this act.

Section 4. Section 2 of this act becomes effective July 1, 2000. The remainder of this act becomes effective July 1, 1999.
