A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 2 AN ACT TO ALLOW LEFT TURNS ON RED IN CERTAIN SITUATIONS AND TO 3 ALLOCATE FUNDS FOR SIGNAGE NECESSARY TO IMPLEMENT THE ACT. 4 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: Section 1. G.S. 20-158(b) reads as rewritten: 5 6 Control of Vehicles at Intersections. – "(b) 7 When a stop sign has been erected or installed at an intersection, it shall (1) 8 be unlawful for the driver of any vehicle to fail to stop in obedience 9 thereto and yield the right-of-way to vehicles operating on the designated main-traveled or through highway. When stop signs have 10 been erected at three or more entrances to an intersection, the driver, 11 after stopping in obedience thereto, may proceed with caution. 12 Vehicles facing a red light controlling traffic passing straight through an 13 (2) intersection from a steady or strobe beam stoplight shall not enter the 14 intersection while the steady or strobe beam stoplight is emitting a red 15 light controlling traffic passing straight through an intersection; provided 16

that, provided:

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- <u>a.</u> <u>except Except</u> where prohibited by an appropriate sign, vehicular traffic facing a red light controlling traffic passing straight through an intersection, after coming to a complete stop at the intersection, may enter the intersection to make a right turn but <u>such the turning</u> vehicle shall yield the right-of-way to pedestrians and to other traffic using the <u>intersection</u>. <u>intersection</u>; <u>or</u>
- b. Except where prohibited by an appropriate sign, vehicular traffic that is (i) in the leftmost lane of travel on a one-way street, (ii) facing a red light, and (iii) at an intersection with another one-way street with traffic travelling from the turning driver's right to the turning driver's left may enter the intersection and make a left turn into the extreme left-hand lane lawfully available to traffic. The turning vehicle shall come to a complete stop and shall yield the right-of-way to pedestrians and to other traffic using the intersection.

When the stoplight is emitting a steady yellow circular light on a traffic signal controlling traffic passing straight through an intersection or a steady yellow arrow light on a traffic signal controlling traffic turning at an intersection, vehicles facing the yellow light are warned that the related green light is being terminated or a red light will be immediately forthcoming. When the stoplight is emitting a steady green light, vehicles may proceed with due care through the intersection subject to the rights of pedestrians and other vehicles as may otherwise be provided by law.

- (3) When a flashing red light has been erected or installed at an intersection, approaching vehicles facing the red light shall stop and yield the right-of-way to vehicles in or approaching the intersection. The right to proceed shall be subject to the rules applicable to making a stop at a stop sign.
- (4) When a flashing yellow light has been erected or installed at an intersection, approaching vehicles facing the yellow flashing light may proceed through the intersection with caution, yielding the right-of-way to vehicles in or approaching the intersection.
- (5) When a stop sign, stoplight, flashing light, or other traffic-control device authorized by subsection (a) of this section requires a vehicle to stop at an intersection, the driver shall stop at (i) an appropriately marked stop line, or if none, (ii) before entering a marked crosswalk, or if none, (iii) before entering the intersection at the point nearest the intersecting street where the driver has a view of approaching traffic on the intersecting street."

1	Section 2. There is allocated from the funds appropriated to the Department of
2	Transportation the sum of ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) for the 1999-2000 fiscal year
	for the signage necessary to implement Section 1 of this act.
4	Section 3. Section 1 of this act becomes effective January 1, 2000. The
5	remainder of this act is effective July 1, 1999.

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
