4	Section 2. G.S. 7A-69 reads as rewritten:				
5	"§ 7A-69. Investigatorial assistants.				
6	The district attorney in prosecutorial districts 1, 3B, 4, 5, 7, 8, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15A,				
7	15B, 18, 19B, 20, 21, 22, 24, 25, 26, 2 7A, 27B, 28, 29, and 30 is entitled to one				
8	investigatorial assistant, and the district attorney in prosecutorial district 10 is entitled to				
9	two investigatorial assistants, to be appointed by the district attorney and to serve at his				
10	pleasure.				
11	It shall be the duty of the investigatorial assistant to investigate cases preparatory to				
12	trial and to perform such other Duties as may be assigned by the district attorney. The				
13	investigatorial assistant is entitled to reimbursement for his subsistence and travel				
14	expenses to the same extent as State employees generally."				
15	Section 3. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Judicial				
16	Department the sum of one million one hundred forty-seven thousand nine hundred forty-				
17	eight dollars (\$1,147,948) for the 2000-2001 fiscal year to replace existing temporary				
18	positions with 11 permanent assistant district attorney positions, to upgrade an				
19	investigatorial assistant position to a permanent assistant district attorney position, and to				
20	provide 11 assistants for administrative and victim and witness services.				
21	Section 4. This act becomes effective July 1, 2000.
