A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO APPOINT PERSONS TO VARIOUS PUBLIC OFFICES UPON THE RECOMMENDATION OF THE PRESIDENT PRO TEMPORE OF THE SENATE OR THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, AND TO MAKE CHANGES IN STATUTES RELATING TO APPOINTMENTS TO PUBLIC OFFICE.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

#### 11 – ROANOKE ISLAND HISTORICAL ASSOCIATION

#### 13 "§ 143-200. Members of board of directors; terms; appointment.

14 The governing body of said Association shall be a board of directors consisting of the  
15 Governor of the State, the Attorney General and the Secretary of Cultural Resources as  
16 ex officio members, and the following 21 members: J. Spencer Love, Greensboro; Miles  
17 Clark, Elizabeth City; Mrs. Richard J. Reynolds, Winston-Salem; D. Hiden Ramsey,  
18 Asheville; Mrs. Charles A. Cannon, Concord; Dr. Fred Hanes, Durham; Mrs. Frank P.  
19 Graham, Chapel Hill; Bishop Thomas C. Darst, Wilmington; W. Dorsey Pruden,  
20 Edenton; John A. Buchanan, Durham; William B. Rodman, Jr., Washington; J. Melville  
21 Broughton, Raleigh; Melvin R. Daniels, Manteo; Paul Green, Chapel Hill; Samuel  
22 Selden, Chapel Hill; R. Bruce Etheridge, Manteo; Theodore S. Meekins, Manteo; Roy L.  
23 Davis, Manteo; M. K. Fearing, Manteo; A. R. Newsome, Chapel Hill. The members of  
24 said board of directors herein named other than the ex officio members, shall serve for a  
25 term of ~~two~~ three years and until their successors are appointed. Appointments thereafter  
26 shall be made by the membership of the Association in regular annual meeting or special

#### 33 34 –FIRST FLIGHT CENTENNIAL COMMISSION

35 Section 3.2.(a) G.S. 143-640(c) reads as rewritten:

36 "(c) Membership. – The Commission shall consist of ~~26~~ 28 members, as follows:

- 37 (1) Four persons appointed by the Governor.  
38 (2) ~~Four~~ Five persons appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the  
39 Senate.  
40 (3) ~~Four~~ Five persons appointed by the Speaker of the House of  
41 Representatives.  
42 (4) The following persons or their designees, ex officio:  
43 a. The Governor.

- 1 b. The President Pro Tempore of the Senate.
- 2 c. The Speaker of the House of Representatives.
- 3 d. The United States Senators from this State.
- 4 e. The member of the United States House of Representatives for
- 5 the Third Congressional District.
- 6 f. The Governor of the State of Ohio.
- 7 g. The Secretary of the Department of Cultural Resources.
- 8 h. The Superintendent of the Cape Hatteras National Seashore of
- 9 the United States National Park Service.
- 10 i. The chair of the Centennial of Flight Commemoration
- 11 Commission.
- 12 j. The President of the First Flight Society.
- 13 k. The chair of the Dare County Board of Commissioners.
- 14 l. The Mayor of the Town of Kill Devil Hills.
- 15 m. The chair of the Dare County Tourism Board.

16 The members appointed to the First Flight Centennial Commission shall be chosen  
17 from among individuals who have the ability and commitment to promote and fulfill the  
18 purposes of the Commission, including individuals who have demonstrated expertise in  
19 the fields of aeronautics, aerospace science, or history, who have contributed to the  
20 development of the fields of aeronautics or aerospace science, or who have demonstrated  
21 a commitment to serving the public."

22 Section 3.2.(b) The initial members appointed under this section shall serve  
23 terms expiring June 30, 2001.

#### 25 –STATE-OWNED RAILROADS

26 Section 3.3.(a) G.S. 124-6(b) reads as rewritten:

27 "(b) Notwithstanding subsection (a) of this section, for any railroad company  
28 organized as a corporation in which the State is the owner of all the voting stock and  
29 which has trackage in more than two counties, ~~five~~seven of the members of the Board of  
30 Directors shall be appointed by the Governor, ~~two~~three of the members of the Board of  
31 Directors shall be appointed by the General Assembly upon the recommendation of the  
32 Speaker of the House of Representatives in accordance with G.S. 120-121, and ~~two~~three  
33 of the members of the Board of Directors shall be appointed by the General Assembly  
34 upon the recommendation of the President Pro Tempore of the Senate in accordance with  
35 G.S. 120-121. ~~Of the Governor's five appointments, three shall be either an investment banker,~~  
36 ~~a person with railroad management experience, a person on an economic development~~  
37 ~~commission whose region contains track of the company, or an attorney with corporate~~  
38 ~~experience. The remaining two shall be at large members. The Speaker of the House of~~  
39 ~~Representatives shall recommend two at large members. The President Pro Tempore of the~~  
40 ~~Senate shall recommend two at large members.~~The Board of Directors shall consist of ~~nine~~  
41 13 members. Of the initial members appointed by the Governor, three shall be appointed  
42 for terms of four years and ~~two~~four shall be appointed for terms of two years. Of the  
43 initial members recommended to the General Assembly by the Speaker of the House of

1 Representatives, ~~one~~ two shall be appointed for a ~~term~~ terms of four years and one shall be  
2 appointed for a term of two years. Of the initial members recommended to the General  
3 Assembly by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, ~~one~~ two shall be appointed for a  
4 ~~term~~ terms of four years and one shall be appointed for a term of two years. Thereafter all  
5 Board members shall serve four-year terms. The Board shall elect the chairman from  
6 among its membership."

7 Section 3.3.(b) This section becomes effective when the railroad company  
8 changes its articles of incorporation to increase the size of the board.

9  
10 –NORTH CAROLINA REAL ESTATE COMMISSION

11 Section 3.4.(a) G.S. 93A-3(a) reads as rewritten:

12 "(a) There is hereby created the North Carolina Real Estate Commission,  
13 hereinafter called the Commission. The Commission shall consist of nine members,  
14 seven members to be appointed by the ~~Governor~~ Governor, one member to be appointed  
15 by the General Assembly upon the recommendation of the President Pro Tempore of the  
16 Senate in accordance with G.S. 120-121, and one member to be appointed by the General  
17 Assembly upon the recommendation of the President Pro Tempore of the Senate in  
18 accordance with G.S. 120-121. At least three members of the Commission shall be  
19 licensed real estate brokers or real estate salesmen. At least two members of the  
20 Commission shall be persons who are not involved directly or indirectly in the real estate

23 members expire in the next year, and the terms of three members expire in the third year  
24 of each three-year period. The members of the Commission shall elect one of their

26 may remove any member of the Commission for misconduct, incompetency, or willful  
27 neglect of duty. The Governor shall have the power to fill all vacancies occurring on the  
28 Commission. ~~Commission~~, except vacancies in legislative appointments shall be filled  
29 under G.S. 120-122."

30 Section 3.4.(b) Appointments of the initial members authorized by this section  
31 are for terms expiring June 30, 2002.

32  
33 –JOINT LEGISLATIVE COMMISSION ON GOVERNMENTAL OPERATIONS

34 Section 3.5.(a) G.S. 120-74 reads as rewritten:

35 "**§ 120-74. Appointment of members; terms of office.**

36 The Commission shall consist of ~~30~~ 34 members. The President pro tempore of the  
37 Senate, the Speaker pro tempore of the House, and the Majority Leader of the Senate and  
38 the Speaker of the House shall serve as ex officio members of the Commission. The  
39 Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint ~~13~~ 15 members from the House.  
40 The President pro tempore of the Senate shall appoint ~~13~~ 15 members from the Senate.  
41 Vacancies created by resignation or otherwise shall be filled by the original appointing  
42 authority. Members shall serve two-year terms beginning and ending on January 15 of the  
43 odd-numbered ~~years, except that initial appointments shall begin on July 1, 1975.~~ years.

1 Members shall not be disqualified from completing a term of service on the Commission  
2 because they fail to run or are defeated for reelection. Resignation or removal from the  
3 General Assembly shall constitute resignation or removal from membership on the  
4 Commission. ~~The terms of the initial members of the Commission shall expire January 15,~~  
5 ~~1977."~~

6 Section 3.5.(b) The initial terms of the four additional members of the Joint  
7 Legislative Commission on Governmental Operations that are added to the Commission  
8 in subsection (a) of this section shall begin on appointment.

9  
10 --LEGISLATIVE SERVICES COMMISSION

11 Section 3.6.(a) G.S. 120-31(a) reads as rewritten:

12 "(a) The Legislative Services Commission shall consist of the President pro  
13 tempore of the Senate, ~~six~~seven Senators appointed by the President pro tempore of the  
14 Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and ~~six~~seven Representatives  
15 appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives. The President pro tempore of  
16 the Senate, and the Speaker of the House shall serve until the selection and qualification  
17 of their respective successors as officers of the General Assembly. The initial appointive  
18 members shall be appointed after the date of ratification of this Article and each shall  
19 serve for the remainder of his elective term of office and until his successor is appointed  
20 or until he ceases to be a member of the General Assembly, whichever occurs first. A  
21 vacancy in one of the appointive positions shall be filled in the same manner that the  
22 vacated position was originally filled, and the person so appointed shall serve for the  
23 remainder of the unexpired term of the person whom he succeeds. In the event the office  
24 of Speaker becomes vacated, the ~~six~~seven Representatives shall elect one of themselves  
25 to perform the duties of the Speaker as required by this Article. In the event the office of  
26 President pro tempore becomes vacated, the ~~six~~seven Senators shall elect one of  
27 themselves to perform the duties of President pro tempore as required by this Article.  
28 Members so elevated shall perform the duties required by this Article until a Speaker or a  
29 President pro tempore is duly elected by the appropriate house."

30 Section 3.6.(b) The initial terms of the two additional members of the Legislative  
31 Services Commission that are added to the Commission in subsection (a) of this section  
32 shall begin on appointment.

33  
34 – JOINT LEGISLATIVE EDUCATION OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE

35 Section 3.7.(a) G.S. 120-70.80 reads as rewritten:

36 "**§ 120-70.80. Creation and membership of Joint Legislative Education Oversight**  
37 **Committee.**

38 The Joint Legislative Education Oversight Committee is established. The Committee  
39 consists of ~~18~~20 members as follows:

- 40 (1) ~~Nine~~Ten members of the Senate appointed by the President Pro  
41 Tempore of the Senate, at least two of whom are members of the  
42 minority party; and

1           (2) ~~Nine~~Ten members of the House of Representatives appointed by the  
2           Speaker of the House of Representatives, at least three of whom are  
3           members of the minority party.

4           Terms on the Committee are for two years and begin on the convening of the General  
5           Assembly in each odd-numbered year, ~~except the terms of the initial members, which~~  
6           ~~begin on appointment and end on the day of the convening of the 1991 General~~  
7           ~~Assembly year.~~ Members may complete a term of service on the Committee even if they  
8           do not seek reelection or are not reelected to the General Assembly, but resignation or  
9           removal from service in the General Assembly constitutes resignation or removal from  
10          service on the Committee.

11          A member continues to serve until his successor is appointed. A vacancy shall be  
12          filled within 30 days by the officer who made the original appointment."

13          Section 3.8.(b) Terms of the additional members authorized by this section  
14          expire upon convening of the 2001 Regular Session of the General Assembly.

15  
16          –STATE BOARD OF CHIROPRACTIC EXAMINERS

17          Section 3.9. G.S. 90-139 reads as rewritten:

18          "**§ 90-139. Creation and membership of Board of Examiners.**

19          (a) The State Board of Chiropractic Examiners is created to consist of ~~seven~~eight  
20          members appointed by the Governor, and General Assembly. ~~Six~~Seven of the members  
21          shall be practicing doctors of chiropractic, who are residents of this State and who have  
22          actively practiced chiropractic in the State for at least eight consecutive years  
23          immediately preceding their appointments; four of these six members shall be appointed  
24          by the Governor, and two by the General Assembly in accordance with G.S. 120-121, one  
25          each upon the recommendation of the President Pro Tempore of the Senate and the  
26          Speaker of the House of Representatives. No more than three members of the Board may  
27          be graduates of the same college or school of chiropractic. The other member shall be a  
28          person chosen by the Governor to represent the public at large. The public member shall  
29          not be a health care provider nor the spouse of a health care provider. For purposes of  
30          Board membership, "health care provider" means any licensed health care professional  
31          and any agent or employee of any health care institution, health care insurer, health care  
32          professional school, or a member of any allied health profession. For purposes of this  
33          section, a person enrolled in a program to prepare him to be a licensed health care  
34          professional or an allied health professional shall be deemed a health care provider. For  
35          purposes of this section, any person with significant financial interest in a health service  
36          or profession is not a public member."

37          Section 4. Unless otherwise provided for in this act, appointments are for  
38          terms to begin when this bill becomes law.

39          Section 5. This act is effective when it becomes law.
