March 29, 1999 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT TO AMEND THE LAWS REGARDING NONHAZARDOUS SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT BY PROHIBITING THE DEPARTMENT TRANSPORTATION FROM BURNING YARD TRASH AND OTHER ORGANIC SOLID WASTE IN HIGHWAY CONSTRUCTION AND MAINTENANCE PROJECTS AND REQUIRING THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION TO RECYCLE OR REUSE THIS WASTE. The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: Section 1. G.S. 130A-309.14(f) is amended by adding a new subdivision to read: "(3) The Department of Transportation shall not, in highway construction and maintenance projects, burn or contract to burn yard trash and other organic solid waste but shall recycle or reuse, or contract to recycle or reuse, this waste. The Department of Transportation may satisfy this subdivision by source separating the yard trash and other organic solid waste and transporting it to a solid waste area that provides and maintains separate yard trash composting facilities."

Section 2. This act becomes effective July 1, 1999, and applies to contracts entered into on or after that date by the Department of Transportation for the construction and maintenance of highways.
