S 1 SENATE BILL 703 Short Title: Hampstead Incorporation. (Local) Sponsors: Senator Ballantine. Referred to: Rules and Operations of the Senate. April 1, 1999 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT TO INCORPORATE THE TOWN OF HAMPSTEAD SUBJECT TO A REFERENDUM. The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: Section 1. A Charter for the Town of Hampstead is enacted to read: "THE CHARTER OF THE TOWN OF HAMPSTEAD. "CHAPTER I. "INCORPORATION AND CORPORATE POWERS. "Section 1.1. **Incorporation and Corporate Powers.** The inhabitants of the Town of Hampstead are a body corporate and politic under the name of the 'Town of Hampstead'. Under that name they shall have all the powers, duties, rights, privileges, and immunities conferred and imposed upon cities by the general law of North Carolina. "CHAPTER II. "CORPORATE BOUNDARIES. "Section 2.1. Corporate Boundaries. Until modified in accordance with the law, the corporate boundaries of the Town of Hampstead are as follows: BEGINNING in Pender County at a point located in the eastern right-of-way line of US 17, said point being the intersection of the southern right-of-way line of Washington Acres Road (SR 1582) and the eastern right-of-way line of US 17; thence running in a westerly direction approximately 100 feet to the western right-of-way line of

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US 17 to a point; said point being the joint property corner of Eugenia K. Dail and Terry 1 2 Lyle Finley and Bertha E.; thence running in a westerly direction along the boundary line 3 between said properties for a distance of 500 feet to a point, said point being the 4 intersection of the Southern and Western lines of the proposed city limits; thence turning 5 and running parallel to and 500 feet west of the western right-of-way line of US 17 for a 6 distance of approximately 5.5 miles to a point, said point being the intersection of the 7 Western and Northern lines of the proposed city limits; thence turning and running South 8 41 Degrees 41 minutes 50 seconds East 500 feet to the western right-of-way line of US 9 17; thence running on the same bearing approximately 100 feet to a point in the eastern 10 right-of-way line of US 17, said point being the intersecting line of the eastern right-ofway of US 17 and the northern right-of-way line of Sloop Point Loop Road (SR 1563); 11 12 thence running along the northern right-of-way line of Sloop Point Loop Road (SR 1563) for approximately 1.6 miles to a point; said point being 90 degrees from the intersection 13 14 of the northern right-of-way line of Sloop Point Loop Road (SR 1563) and the northern 15 right-of-way line of Hickory Point Road (SR 1607); thence running in an eastern direction along the northern right-of-way line of Hickory Point Road approximately 0.4 16 17 miles to the end of said road, thence continuing on the same bearing of Hickory Point 18 Road approximately 300 feet to the western boundary of the Intracoastal Waterway, said point being the intersection of the Northern and Eastern lines of the proposed city limits; 19 20 thence turning and running in a southerly direction along the ICW for approximately 5.6 21 miles to a point located at the intersection of the ICW and a line extended on the same bearing from the southern right-of-way line of Washington Acres Road (SR 1582), said 22 23 point being the intersection of the Eastern and Southern lines of the proposed city limits; 24 thence turning and running in a northwesterly direction, at the same bearing as the southern right-of-way line of Washington Acres Road (SR 1582), for approximately 450 25 feet to the most eastern end of said road; thence continuing along the southern right-of-26 27 way line of Washington Acres Road (SR 1582) approximately 1.8 miles to the point of beginning. 28 29

"CHAPTER III. "GOVERNING BODY.

"Section 3.1. **Structure of the Governing Body; Number of Members.** The governing body of the Town of Hampstead shall be the Town Council, which shall have five members.

"Section 3.2. **Manner of Election of the Council.** Except for the temporary officers provided for in Section 3.3 of this Charter, the members of the Town Council shall be elected to two-year terms and shall be elected at large by all the qualified voters of the Town.

"Section 3.3. **Temporary Officers.** Until the regular municipal election in November, 1999, Roland Howard, Sr., Billie Oliver, Rose Schenker, Charles Jones, and Charles Watson shall serve on the Town Council for the Town of Hampstead and they shall possess and may exercise the powers granted to the Town Council until their successors are elected and qualified.

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"Section 3.4. **Election of Mayor.** The majority of the Town Council shall, from 1 2 3 4 which he or she was elected. 5

among the membership of the Town Council, elect a Mayor who shall serve at the pleasure of the Town Council, but who shall not serve for a term longer than that for The Mayor's duties and responsibilities shall be as determined by the Town Council and as provided by general law.

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"CHAPTER IV. "ELECTIONS.

"Section 4.1. Conduct of the Town Elections. Regular municipal elections shall be held in each odd-numbered year in accordance with the municipal election laws of North Carolina. Town officers shall be elected on a nonpartisan basis and the results determined using the nonpartisan plurality method as provided in G.S. 163-292.

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"CHAPTER V. "ADMINISTRATION.

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"Section 5.1. Form of Government. The Town of Hampstead shall operate under the Council-Manager form of government as provided in Part 2 of Article 7 of Chapter 160A of the General Statutes."

Section 2. The Pender County Board of Elections shall conduct an election on a date set by the Board, to be not less than 60 nor more than 120 days after this act becomes law, for the purpose of submission to the qualified voters of the area described in Section 2.1 of the Charter of the Town of Hampstead the question of whether or not the area shall be incorporated as the Town of Hampstead. Registration for the election shall be conducted in accordance with G.S. 163-288.2.

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Section 3. In the election, the question on the ballot shall be:

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"[]FOR []AGAINST INCORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF HAMPSTEAD."

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Section 4. In the election, if a majority of the votes are cast "For incorporation of the Town of Hampstead", Section 1 of this act shall become effective on the date that the Pender County Board of Elections certifies the results of the election. Otherwise, that section shall have no force and effect.

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Section 5. This act is effective when it becomes law.
