April 7, 1999 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR THE REGULATION OF CERTAIN EXCAVATION AND GRADING ACTIVITIES UNDER THE SEDIMENTATION POLLUTION CONTROL ACT OF 1973 INSTEAD OF THE MINING ACT OF 1971. The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: Section 1. G.S. 74-49(7) reads as rewritten: 'Mining' means: "(7)The breaking of the surface soil in order to facilitate or a. accomplish the extraction or removal of minerals, ores, or other solid matter. Any activity or process constituting all or part of a process for b. the extraction or removal of minerals, ores, soils, and other solid matter from their original location. The preparation, washing, cleaning, or other treatment of c. minerals, ores, or other solid matter so as to make them suitable for commercial, industrial, or construction use. 'Mining' does not include: Those aspects of deep mining not having significant effect on the a. surface, where the affected land does not exceed one acre in area.
