1	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2	AN ACT AUTHORIZING LOCAL BOARDS OF EDUCATION TO ADOPT
3	POLICIES ADDRESSING THE SEXUAL HARASSMENT OF SCHOOL
4	EMPLOYEES, AND TO CLARIFY THE LAW PROHIBITING RETALIATION
5	AGAINST EMPLOYEES WHO REPORT SEXUAL HARASSMENT.
6	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
7	SECTION 1. Part 8 of Article 22 of Chapter 115C of the General Statutes
8	reads as rewritten:
9	"Part 8. Protection for Reporting Harassment. Sexual Harassment Policies.
10	"§ 115C-335.5. Protection Policies addressing harassment of school employees:
11	protection against retaliation for reporting harassment.
12	(a) Each local board of education may adopt a policy addressing the sexual
13	harassment of local board employees by students, other local board employees, or
14	school board members. The policy may, at a minimum, set out (i) the consequences of
15	sexually harassing school employees and (ii) a procedure for reporting incidents of
16	sexual harassment.
17	(b) No employee of a local board of education or employee of a local board shall
18	be disciplined in any discharge, threaten, or otherwise retaliate against another
19	employee of the board regarding that employee's compensation, terms, conditions,
20	location, or privileges of employment because the employee way solely for the reason
21	that the employee has filed files a written complaint alleging sexual harassment by
22	students, other local board employees, or school board members, unless the employee
23	reporting the harassment knows knew or has reason to believe should have known the
24	report is <u>was</u> false."
25	SECTION 2. This act becomes effective July 1, 2001.

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
