11	(b) Consumption at Off-Premises Establishment It shall be unlawful to				
12	consume, or for a permittee to allow the consumption of, malt beverages or unfortified				
13	wine on any premises having only an off-premises permit for the kind of alcoholic				
14	beverage being consumed.				
15	(c) Loo	cal Ordinance. – A city or county may by ordinance:

8	Local governments may regulate the sale of malt beverages in kegs to persons other		
9	than those hold	ing permits issued under G.S. 18B-1001(1). Any ordinance passed to	
10	implement the	authorization contained in this section shall contain the following	
11	provisions:		
12	<u>(1)</u>	An application for purchase of a keg of malt beverage shall be	
13		completed by each purchaser and shall contain the following	
14		information:	
15		<u>a.</u> <u>The name and location of the seller.</u>	
16		b. The number and sizes of kegs of malt beverage being	
17		purchased.	
18		<u>c.</u> <u>The destination of the keg of malt beverage including the name</u>	
19		of the owner and the address of the location.	
20		<u>d.</u> <u>The name, address, date of birth, and drivers license number of</u>	
21		the purchaser.	
22	<u>(2)</u>	A requirement that the application required by subdivision (1) of this	
23		section shall be kept by the seller for a period of one year and shall be	
24		available for inspection by any law enforcement officer during regular	
25	~	business hours."
