A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 2 AN ACT TO CONFIRM THE DATE ON WHICH STATE REQUIREMENTS 3 GOVERNING THE CONCENTRATION OF SULFUR IN GASOLINE BECOMES 4 EFFECTIVE AND TO PROVIDE THAT GASOLINE THAT MEETS FEDERAL 5 REOUIREMENTS GOVERNING THE CONCENTRATION OF SULFUR IN 6 GASOLINE SHALL DEEMED TO WITH BE COMPLY **STATE** 7 REQUIREMENTS GOVERNING THE CONCENTRATION OF SULFUR IN 8 GASOLINE DURING THE TWO-YEAR PERIOD ALLOWED FOR THE TRANSITION TO LOW-SULFUR GASOLINE BY FEDERAL REGULATIONS. 9 10 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: SECTION 1. Section 2.2 of S.L. 1999-328 reads as rewritten: 11 "Section 2.2. Section 2.1 of this act becomes effective as provided in this section. No 12 later than 1 July 2000, the Governor shall determine whether the United States 13 14 Environmental Protection Agency has adopted, pursuant to the Notice of Proposed Rulemaking published on 13 May 1999 in the Federal Register, Volume 64, Number 92, 15 Page 26003 et seq., regulations applicable to gasoline manufactured, sold, and offered 16 for sale in this State that limit the sulfur content of gasoline to a concentration equal to 17 or less than the concentration set out in Section 2.1 of this act. If the Governor so 18 determines, the Governor shall issue an Executive Order setting out the date on which 19 20 Section 2.1 of this act becomes effective, which shall be the date on which the federal 21 regulation becomes effective in this State. Otherwise, Section 2.1 of this act becomes effective 1 January 2004. If the United States Environmental Protection Agency 22 promulgates a regulation that imposes a limit on the concentration of sulfur in gasoline 23 24 other than that set out in G.S. 119-26.2, as enacted by Section 2.1 of this act, it is the 25 intention of the General Assembly to review the limit established in G.S. 119-26.2. In that event, the Environmental Review Commission shall review the limit on the 26

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- concentration of sulfur in gasoline and report its findings and recommendations, if any,
 to the General Assembly."
- 3 **SECTION 2.** Gasoline that meets the requirements of Tier 2 Motor Vehicle 4 Emissions Standards and Gasoline Sulfur Control Requirements as set out in 65 Federal
- 5 Register No. 28 (10 February 2000) pages 6698 through 6870, as codified in 40 Code of 6 Federal Regulations Parts 80, 85, and 96 (1 July 2001 Edition), shall be deemed to
- 7 comply with the requirements of G.S. 119-26.2.
- 8 **SECTION 3.** This act is effective when it becomes law. Section 2 of this act 9 expires 1 January 2006.
