8	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:			
9	SECTION 1. G.S. 85B-3.2 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:			
10	"(g) The Commission shall collect any fees required by the Department of Justice			
11	and shall remit the fees to the Department of Justice for expenses associated with			
12	conducting the criminal history record check."			
13	SECTION 2. G.S. 85B-4(e1) reads as rewritten:			
14	"(e1) The Commission may require licensees to complete annually not more than			
15	six hours of Commission-approved continuing education courses prior to license			
16	renewal. The Commission may impose different continuing education requirements,			
17	including no such requirements, upon the classes of licensees under this Chapter. The			
18	Commission may waive any or all continuing education requirements in cases of			
19	hardship, disability, or illness, or under other circumstances as the Commission deems			
20	appropriate. The Commission may adopt rules not inconsistent with the provisions of			
21	this Chapter to establish continuing education requirements, including rules that govern			
22	any of the following:			
23	(1) The content and subject matter of continuing education courses.			
24	(2) <u>The curriculum of required continuing education courses.</u>			
25	(3) The criteria, standards, and procedures for the approval of courses,			
26	course sponsors, and course instructors.			
27	(4) The methods of instruction for continuing education courses.			
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28 (5) The computation of course credit.

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1	(6) The number of credit hours needed annually.		
2	(7) The ability to carry forward course credit from one year	to another.	
3	(8) The waiver of the continuing education requirement f	<u>or hardship or</u>	
4	other reasons to be determined by the Commission.		
5	(9) The procedures for compliance and noncompliance w	ith continuing	
6	education requirements."		
7	SECTION 3. G.S. 85B-3.1 is amended by adding the f	following new	
8	subsections to read:		
9	"(c) The Commission shall have the power to acquire, hold, re	ent, encumber,	
10	alienate, and otherwise deal with real property in the same manner as a property in the same manner	ivate person or	
11	corporation, subject only to approval of the Governor and the Council of State as to the		
12	acquisition, rental, encumbering, leasing, and sale of real property. Collateral pledged

15	(d) The Commission may purchase, rent, or lease equipment and	d supplies and	
16	purchase liability insurance or other insurance to cover the activities of the Commission,		
17	its operations, or its employees."		
18	SECTION 4. This act is effective when it becomes law.
