| 8 | perceptible to the senses. The term does not include stocks, bonds, |
| 9 | notes, insurance, or other obligations or securities, nor does it include |
| 10 | water delivered by or through main lines or pipes either for |
| 11 | commercial or domestic use or consumption. The term includes |
| 12 | computer software whether delivered electronically or on a storage |
| 13 | medium, such as a cd rom, a disk, or a tape." |
| 14 | SECTION 2. This act becomes effective July 1, 2001, and applies to sales |
