A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 2 AN ACT TO PROVIDE THAT PERSONS CONVICTED OF OFFENSES 3 INVOLVING DRIVING AWAY WITHOUT PAYING FOR GASOLINE OR 4 MOTOR FUEL SHALL HAVE THEIR DRIVERS LICENSE SUSPENDED. 5 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: **SECTION 1.** G.S. 14-72 is amended by adding a new subsection to read: 6 The following alternatives apply when the larceny or receiving or possession 7 "(e) 8 of stolen goods as described in subsection (a) of this section involves the theft of motor 9 fuel: 10 (1) In addition to the fine and imprisonment otherwise authorized by this section, the court may order the suspension of the drivers license of a 11 person convicted of violating this section for a first time for a period of 12 not to exceed six months if the conviction involved a person driving 13 his or her motor vehicle off the premises of an establishment where 14 gasoline is offered for retail sale after dispensing gasoline or motor 15 16

- vehicle fuel into the fuel tank of a motor vehicle and failing to remit payment or make an authorized charge for the gasoline or motor vehicle fuel that was dispensed.
- In addition to the fine or imprisonment otherwise authorized by this (2) section, the court shall order the suspension of the drivers license of a person convicted of violating this section for a second time for a period of six months if both convictions involved are of the type specified in subdivision (1) of this subsection.
- In addition to the fine and imprisonment otherwise authorized by this (3) section, the court shall order the suspension of the drivers license of a person convicted of violating this section for a third or subsequent time for a period of one year if all of the convictions involved are of the type specified in subdivision (1) of this subsection.

1	<u>(4)</u>	If a person's drivers license has been suspended under the provisions
2		of subdivision (1) of this subsection, then the court may allow the
3		continued use of a restricted drivers license under the applicable
4		provisions of G.S. 20-16.1(b) and (g). The person shall pay the
5		restoration fee required by G.S. 20-7(i1) prior to the restoration of a
6		drivers license suspended under this subsection."
