If that vehicle is in the leftmost lane of travel on a one-way 1 b. 2 street that intersects with another one-way street with traffic 3 traveling from the turning driver's right to the turning driver's 4 left, then that vehicle may enter the intersection and make a left 5 turn into the extreme left-hand lane lawfully available to traffic. 6 The turning vehicle shall yield the right-of-way to pedestrians 7 and to other traffic using the intersection. When the a stoplight is emitting a steady yellow circular light on a 8 (2a) 9 traffic signal controlling traffic passing straight through an intersection 10 or a steady yellow arrow light on a traffic signal controlling traffic 11 turning at an intersection, vehicles facing the yellow light are warned 12 that the related green light is being terminated or a red light will be 13 immediately forthcoming. When the stoplight is emitting a steady 14 green light, vehicles may proceed with due care through the 15 intersection subject to the rights of pedestrians and other vehicles as may otherwise be provided by law. 16 17 (3) When a flashing red light has been erected or installed at an 18 intersection, approaching vehicles facing the red light shall stop and 19 yield the right-of-way to vehicles in or approaching the intersection. 20 The right to proceed shall be subject to the rules applicable to making 21 a stop at a stop sign. 22 When a flashing yellow light has been erected or installed at an (4) 23 intersection, approaching vehicles facing the vellow flashing light may 24 proceed through the intersection with caution, yielding 25 right-of-way to vehicles in or approaching the intersection. 26 When a stop sign, stoplight, flashing light, or other traffic-control (5) 27 device authorized by subsection (a) of this section requires a vehicle to 28 stop at an intersection, the driver shall stop at (i) an appropriately 29 marked stop line, or if none, (ii) before entering a marked crosswalk, 30 or if none, (iii) before entering the intersection at the point nearest the 31 intersecting street where the driver has a view of approaching traffic
