7	SECTION 1. G.S. 159C-3(15a) reads as rewritten:		
8	"(15a) Special purpose project. – Any structure, equipment, or other facility		
9	for any one or more of the following purposes:		
10	a.	Water systems or facilities, including all plants, works,	
11		instrumentalities, and properties used or useful in obtaining,	
12		conserving, treating, and distributing water for domestic or	
13		industrial use, irrigation, sanitation, fire protection, or any other	
14		public or private use.	
15	b.	Sewage disposal systems or facilities, including all plants,	
16		works, instrumentalities, and properties used or useful in the	
17		collection, treatment, purification, or disposal of sewage, other	
18		than facilities constituting a water pollution control facility.

SECTION 4. Chapter 159D of the General Statutes is amended by adding a		
new section to read:		
" <u>§ 159D-58. Joint projects; local government and State participation.</u>		
(a) <u>Projects or portions of projects separately or jointly owned by the State or an</u>		
agency thereof, a political subdivision, or a special purpose institution as defined in G.S.		
159D-37 may be financed pursuant to this Article either jointly or separately as may be		
determined by the Local Government Commission.		
(b) The costs of projects to be acquired, constructed, and owned by a special		
purpose institution which are expected to be leased or sold to the State or an agency		
thereof or a political subdivision upon their completion and acceptance by the State or		
an agency thereof or a political subdivision may be financed under this Article with		
such special purpose institution as the participating institution and the anticipated lease		
or installment sale agreement to the State or an agency thereof or a political subdivision		
taken into account under G.S. 159D-40(b)."		
SECTION 5. This act is effective when it becomes law.
