2	AN ACT TO APPOINT PERSONS TO VARIOUS PUBLIC OFFICES UPON THE
3	RECOMMENDATION OF THE PRESIDENT PRO TEMPORE OF THE SENATE
4	AND THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES AND TO
5	MAKE VARIOUS CHANGES TO THE APPOINTMENTS TO BOARDS AND
6	COMMISSIONS.
7	Whereas, G.S. 120-121 authorizes the General Assembly to make certain
8	appointments to public offices upon the recommendation of the President Pro Tempore
9	of the Senate and of the Speaker of the House of Representatives; and
10	Whereas, the President Pro Tempore of the Senate and the Speaker of the
11	House of Representatives have made recommendations; Now, therefore,
12	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

SECTION 4.3. G.S. 93A-3(a) reads as rewritten:

7 There is hereby created the North Carolina Real Estate Commission, "(a) hereinafter called the Commission. The Commission shall consist of nine eleven 8 9 members, seven members to be appointed by the Governor, one membertwo members 10 to be appointed by the General Assembly upon the recommendation of the President Pro Tempore of the Senate in accordance with G.S. 120-121, and one members members 11 12 to be appointed by the General Assembly upon the recommendation of the Speaker of 13 the House of Representatives in accordance with G.S. 120-121. At least three members 14 of the Commission shall be licensed real estate brokers or real estate salespersons. At 15 least two members of the Commission shall be persons who are not involved directly or 16 indirectly in the real estate or real estate appraisal business. Members of the 17 Commission shall serve three-year terms, so staggered that the terms of three members 18 expire in one year, the terms of three members expire in the next year, and the terms of 19 three members expire in the third year of each three-year period. The members of the 20 Commission shall elect one of their members to serve as chairman of the Commission 21 for a term of one year. The Governor may remove any member of the Commission for misconduct, incompetency, or willful neglect of duty. The Governor shall have the 22 23 power to fill all vacancies occurring on the Commission, except vacancies in legislative 24 appointments shall be filled under G.S. 120-122."

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--NORTH CAROLINA APPRAISAL BOARD

SECTION 4.4. G.S. 93E-1-5(a) reads as rewritten:

There is created the North Carolina Appraisal Board for the purposes set forth 28 "(a) 29 in this Chapter. The Board shall consist of seven-nine members. The Governor shall 30 appoint five members of the Board, and the General Assembly shall appoint two-four members in accordance with G.S. 120-121, one-two upon the recommendation of the 31 32 President Pro Tempore of the Senate and one-two upon the recommendation of the 33 Speaker of the House of Representatives. Members appointed by the Governor shall be appointed from geographically diverse areas of the State. The appointee appointees 34 35 recommended by the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the appointees of the Governor shall be persons who have been engaged in the business of real estate 36 37 appraising in this State for at least five years immediately preceding their appointment 38 and are also State-licensed or State-certified real estate appraisers. No more than three 39 of the appointees may be members of the same appraiser trade organization at any one time. The appointee appointees recommended by the President Pro Tempore of the 40 Senate shall be a person persons not involved directly or indirectly in the real estate, real 41 42 estate appraisal, or the real estate lending industry. Members of the Board shall serve three-year terms, so staggered that the terms of three members expire in one year, the 43 44 terms of two members expire in the next year, and the terms of two members expire in

the third year of each three-year period. The members of the Board shall elect one of 1 2 their members to serve as chairman of the Board for a term of one year. The Governor 3 may remove any member of the Board appointed by the Governor for misconduct, incompetency, or neglect of duty. The General Assembly may remove any member 4 appointed by it for the same reasons. Successors shall be appointed by the appointing 5 6 authority making the original appointment. All vacancies occurring on the Board shall be filled, for the unexpired term, by the appointing authority making the original 7 8 appointment. Vacancies in appointments made by the General Assembly shall be filled 9 in accordance with G.S. 120-122. Initial terms of office commenced July 1, 1994."

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--STRUCTURAL PEST CONTROL COMMITTEE

SECTION 4.5. G.S. 106-65.23(c) reads as rewritten:

13 "(c) There is hereby created a Structural Pest Control Committee to be composed of the following members. The Commissioner shall appoint one member of the 14 15 Committee who is not in the structural pest control business for a four-year term. The 16 Commissioner of Agriculture shall designate an employee of the Department of 17 Agriculture and Consumer Services to serve on the Committee at the pleasure of the 18 Commissioner. The dean of the School of Agriculture of North Carolina State 19 University at Raleigh shall appoint one member of the Committee who shall serve for 20 one term of two years and who shall be a member of the entomology faculty of the 21 University. The vacancy occurring on the Committee by the expired term of the member from the entomology faculty of the University shall be filled by the dean of the School 22 23 of Agriculture of North Carolina State University at Raleigh who shall designate any 24 person of the dean's choice from the entomology faculty of the University to serve on 25 the Committee at the pleasure of the dean. The Secretary of Health and Human Services shall appoint one member of the Committee who shall be an epidemiologist and who 26 27 shall serve at the pleasure of the Secretary. The Governor shall appoint two members of the Committee who are actively engaged in the pest control industry, who are licensed 28 29 in at least two phases of structural pest control as provided under G.S. 106-65.25(a), and 30 who are residents of the State of North Carolina but not affiliates of the same company.

The Governor's initial appointees from the pest control industry shall be appointed as 31 32 follows: one for a two-year term and one for a three-year term. The Governor shall appoint one member of the Committee who is a public member and who is unaffiliated 33 34 with the structural pest control industry, the pesticide industry, the Department of 35 Agriculture and Consumer Services, the Department of Health and Human Services and the School of Agriculture at North Carolina State University at Raleigh. The initial 36 public member shall be appointed for a term of two years, commencing July 1, 1991. 37 38 After the initial appointments by the Governor, all ensuing appointments by the 39 Governor shall be for terms of four years. Any vacancy occurring on the Committee by reason of death, resignation, or otherwise shall be filled by the Governor or the 40 Commissioner of Agriculture, as the case may be, for the unexpired term of the member 41 42 whose seat is vacant.

33	shall be filled by the appointing official in the original manner. An appointment to fill a
34	vacancy on the Board of Trustees created by the resignation, removal, disability, or
35	death of a member shall be for the balance of the unexpired term. Vacancies in
36	appointments made by the General Assembly shall be as provided in G.S. 120-122.
37	(e) Frequency of Meetings. – The <u>Board of Trustees</u> shall meet at least twice
38	each year and may hold special meetings at the call of the Chair or a majority of the
39	members.
40	(f) Per Diem and Expenses. — The Trustees Each member shall receive per diem
41	and necessary travel and subsistence expenses in accordance with the provisions of G.S.
42	138-5. Per diem, subsistence, and travel expenses of the Trustees shall be paid from the
43	Fund.
