A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO AMEND THE REGISTRATION REQUIREMENTS AND FEES TO
ENGAGE IN CERTAIN ACTIVITIES WITH CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

SECTION 1. Article 5 of Chapter 90 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new section to read:

"§ 90-102.1. Registration of certain persons requiring limited use of controlled substances for training purposes in certain businesses.

(a) A person who applies to register to use controlled substances included in Schedules I through VI for the purposes of training and maintaining the training of detector dogs shall apply as a researcher under G.S. 90-101 but shall pay a fee of one hundred sixty dollars (\$160.00).

(b) Unless required by federal law, the Department of Health and Human Services shall not require as a condition of registration that a person applying under this section have a nexus or association with a law enforcement group or authority before issuing a registration. Unless required by federal law, the Department shall not require as a condition of registration that a person report dog alerts or finds of controlled substances to a law enforcement agency.

SECTION 2. This act is effective when it becomes law.
