## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2	AN ACT TO INCREASE THE TAX CREDIT FOR PERMITTING GLEANING OF
3	CROPS AND TO ESTABLISH A CREDIT AGAINST INCOME TAX FOR THE
4	DONATION OF HARVESTED AND PACKAGED FRESH PRODUCE.
5	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
6	<b>SECTION 1</b> . G.S. 105-130.37(a) reads as rewritten:
7	"(a) Any corporation that grows a crop and permits the gleaning of the crop
8	during the taxable year is allowed a credit against the tax imposed by this Part equal to
9	ten percent (10%) fifty percent (50%) of the market price of the quantity of the gleaned
10	crop. This credit may not exceed the amount of tax imposed by this Part for the taxable
11	year reduced by the sum of all credits allowable, except tax payments made by or on
12	behalf of the taxpayer. No deduction is allowed under G.S. 105-130.5(b)(5) for the
13	items for which a credit is claimed under this section. Any unused portion of the credit
14	may be carried forward for the succeeding five years."
15	<b>SECTION 2.</b> G.S. 105-151.14(a) reads as rewritten:
16	"(a) A taxpayer who grows a crop and permits the gleaning of the crop during the
17	taxable year shall be allowed as a credit against the tax imposed by this Part an amount
18	equal to ten percent (10%) fifty percent (50%) of the market price of the quantity of the
19	gleaned crop. This credit may not exceed the amount of tax imposed by this Part for the
20	taxable year reduced by the sum of all credits allowable, except tax payments made by
21	or on behalf of the taxpayer. In order to claim the credit allowed under this section, the
22	taxpayer must add the market price of the gleaned crop to taxable income as provided in
23	G.S. 105-134.6(c). Any unused portion of the credit may be carried forward for the next
24	succeeding five years."
25	<b>SECTION 3.</b> Part 1 of Article 4 of Chapter 105 of the General Statutes is
26	amended by adding a new section to read:

27 "<u>§ 105-130.37A. Credit for donating fresh produce.</u>

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1	(a) Any corporation that donates fresh produce after harvesting, or that donates
2	fresh produce that has been packaged or otherwise prepared for market, to a nonprofit
3	organization during the taxable year is allowed a credit against the tax imposed by this
4	Part equal to ten percent (10 %) of the market price of the fresh produce donated. This
5	credit may not exceed the amount of tax imposed by this Part for the taxable year
6	reduced by the sum of all credits allowable, except tax payments made by or on behalf
7	of the taxpayer. No deduction is allowed under G.S. 105-130.5(b)(5) for the items for
8	which a credit is claimed under this section. Any unused portion of the credit may be
9	carried forward for the succeeding five years.
10	(b) The following definitions apply in this section:
11	(1) 'Fresh produce' means recently harvested fruits and vegetables that
12	have been subjected to only minimal, if any, processing.
13	(2) <u>'Market price' means the average wholesale price for the particular</u>
14	kind of fresh produce in the nearest local market for the month in
15	which the produce is donated.
16	(3) 'Nonprofit organization' means an organization to which charitable
17	contributions are deductible from gross income under the Code."
18	SECTION 4. Part 2 of Article 4 of Chapter 105 of the General Statutes is
19	amended by adding a new section to read:
20	" <u>§ 105-151.14A. Credit for donation of fresh produce.</u>
21	(a) <u>A taxpayer who donates fresh produce after harvesting, or who donates fresh</u>
22	produce that has been packaged or otherwise prepared for market, to a nonprofit
23	organization during the taxable year is allowed a credit against the tax imposed by this
24	Part equal to ten percent (10%) of the market price of the fresh produce donated. This
25	credit may not exceed the amount of tax imposed by this Part for the taxable year
26	reduced by the sum of all credits allowable, except tax payments made by or on behalf
27	of the taxpayer. In order to claim the credit allowed under this section, the taxpayer
28	must add the market price of the donated produce to taxable income as provided in G.S.
29	105-134.6(c). Any unused portion of the credit may be carried forward for the
30	succeeding five years.
31	(b) The following definitions apply in this section:
32	(1) <u>'Fresh produce' means fruits and vegetables that have been subjected to</u>
33	only minimal, if any, processing.
34	(2) <u>'Market price' means the average wholesale price for the particular</u>
35	kind of fresh produce in the nearest local market for the month in
36	which the produce is donated.
37	(3) <u>'Nonprofit organization' means an organization to which charitable</u>
38	contributions are deductible from gross income under the Code."
39	<b>SECTION 5.</b> This act is effective for taxable years beginning on or after
40	January 1, 2001.
