3	SECTION 1.(c) Outreach strategies shall include:
4	(1) Community education, including integration into pertinent community
5	college curricula on estate and financial planning.
6	(2) The Internet.
7	(3) Mass media.
8	(4) Information about the Seniors Health Insurance Information Program
9	(SHIIP) in the Department of Insurance.
10	SECTION 2. Not later than March 1, 2002, the Department of Insurance
11	shall report on the implementation of long-term care outreach efforts to the Senate and
12	House of Representatives Appropriations Subcommittees on General Government and
13	Health and Human Services, and to the Fiscal Research Division of the Legislative
14	Services Office.
15	SECTION 3. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the
16	Department of Insurance the sum of two hundred sixty-eight thousand dollars
17	(\$268,000) for the 2001-2002 fiscal year and the sum of two hundred sixty-eight
18	thousand dollars (\$268,000) for the 2002-2003 fiscal year to implement the long-term
19	care outreach efforts required by this act.
20	SECTION 4. This act becomes effective July 1, 2001.
