AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE LEGISLATIVE RESEARCH COMMISSION TO STUDY ISSUES OF PERSONAL PRIVACY PROTECTIONS.

SECTION 1. The Legislative Research Commission may study issues related to personal privacy. If this study is undertaken, the Commission shall examine issues related to protections for personal privacy, including the following:

- Privacy protection of nonpublic personal financial information. (1)
- Privacy protection of personal consumer information. (2)
- Privacy protection of personal information collected on students by or 10 (3) through schools and their contractors. 11
 - Privacy protection of Internet use and use of electronic messaging. (4)
- 13 Privacy protections for children online. (5)
- 14 Privacy protection of medical records and personal health information. (6)
- Privacy protection of personal insurance information. 15 (7)

SECTION 2. The Commission may report to the 2002 Session of the 2001 16 17 General Assembly or to the 2003 General Assembly on its findings and may make any legislative recommendations it considers appropriate. 18

SECTION 3. This act becomes effective July 1, 2001.
