7	INJURIES INCURRED IN THE LINE OF DUTY.
8	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
9	<b>SECTION 1.</b> G.S. 128-26(g) reads as rewritten:
10	"(g) During-Except as provided in subsection (g1) of this section, during periods
11	when a member is on leave of absence and is receiving less than his full compensation,
12	he will be deemed to be in service only if he is contributing to the Retirement System as
13	provided in G.S. 128-30(b)(4). If he is so contributing, the annual rate of compensation
14	paid to such employee immediately before the leave of absence began will be deemed to
15	be the actual compensation rate of the employee during the leave of absence."
16	<b>SECTION 2.</b> G.S. 128-26 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:
17	"(g1) Creditable service at retirement shall include a period of up to one year of
18	employer-approved leaves of absence when a member who is a law enforcement officer
19	is in receipt of benefits under the Workers' Compensation Act as a result of injury
20	incurred in the line of duty, by another person's felonious criminal action through the
21	use of a deadly weapon. In that case, the employer shall make the employer contribution
22	during those periods, and may also make the employee contribution during those
23	periods, but is not required to do so."
24	<b>SECTION 3.</b> This act is effective when it becomes law.
