1 A HOUSE RESOLUTION HONORING THE MEMORY OF THE SERVICEMEN
2 WHO LOST THEIR LIVES ON D-DAY AND EXPRESSING APPRECIATION
3 TO NORTH CAROLINA'S D-DAY VETERANS ON THE 60TH ANNIVERSARY
4 OF D-DAY.

5 Whereas, June 6, 2004, marks the 60th anniversary of D-Day, the first day the
6 Allied Forces mostly composed of American, British, and Canadian troops stormed the
7 beaches of Normandy, France during World War II; and

8 Whereas, this invasion, known as Operation Overlord, was the largest buildup
9 and movement of servicemen in the history of warfare, involving on the first day of the
10 operation 5,000 naval vessels, more than 11,000 sorties, and 153,000 members of the
11 Allied Forces; and

12 Whereas, D-Day was a significant turning point in World War II, leading to
13 the eventual defeat and downfall of Hitler's army; and

14 Whereas, 6,500 American soldiers, sailors, and airmen lost their lives on
15 D-Day, some of whom were from North Carolina; and

16 Whereas, the servicemen who participated in D-Day should be commended
17 and recognized for their bravery and sacrifice while fighting for the freedom of others;
18 Now, therefore,

19 Be it resolved by the House of Representatives:

20 **SECTION 1.** The House of Representatives wishes to honor the memory of
21 the soldiers, sailors, and airmen from North Carolina who lost their lives on June 6,
22 1944, and expresses its appreciation to the veterans of D-Day who are residents of
23 North Carolina.

24 **SECTION 2.** The House of Representatives encourages the people of this
25 State to participate in all activities honoring the 60th anniversary of D-Day.

26 **SECTION 3.** This resolution is effective upon adoption.
