The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:		
<b>SECTION 1.</b> G.S. 116-143.3(b) reads as rewritten:		
"(b) Any member of the armed services qualifying for admission to an institution		
of higher education as defined in G.S. 116-143.1(a)(3) but not qualifying as a resident		
for tuition purposes under G.S. 116-143.1 shall be charged the out of State tuition rate;		
provided that the out of State truition shall be forgiven to the extent that the out of State		

4 5 6 7 8 9 10 provided, that the out of State tuition shall be forgiven to the extent that the out of State 11 tuition rate exceeds any amounts payable to the institution or the service member by the 12 service member's employer by reason of enrollment pursuant to such admission while the member is abiding in this State incident to active military duty, plus the amount that 13 14 represents the percentage of the out of State tuition rate paid to the institution or the 15 service member by the service member's employer multiplied by the in-State tuition rate and then subtracted from the in-State tuition rate. Any member of the armed services 16 17 who does not qualify for any payment by the member's employer shall be eligible to be charged the in State tuition rate and shall pay the full amount of the in State tuition rate. 18 19 charged the in-State tuition rate for enrollments while the member of the armed services is abiding in this State incident to active military duty in this State." 20

21 **SECTION 2.** This act becomes effective July 1, 2003.
