forgiven to the extent that the out of State tuition rate exceeds any amounts payable to the institution or the service member by the service member's employer by reason of enrollment pursuant to such admission while the member is abiding in this State incident to active military duty, plus the amount that represents the percentage of the out-of-State tuition rate paid to the institution or the service member by the service member's employer multiplied by the in State tuition rate and then subtracted from the in State tuition rate.

- (b1) Any <u>active duty</u> member of the armed services who does not qualify for any payment by the member's employer <u>pursuant to paragraph</u> (b) of this <u>section</u> shall be eligible to be charged the in-State tuition rate and shall pay the full amount of the in-State tuition <u>rate-rate</u> and <u>applicable mandatory fees.</u>
- (c) Any dependent relative of a member of the armed services who is abiding in this State incident to active military duty, as defined by the Board of Governors of The University of North Carolina and by the State Board of Community Colleges while sharing the abode of that member shall be eligible to be charged the in-State tuition rate, if the dependent relative qualifies for admission to an institution of higher education as defined in G.S. 116-143.1(a)(3). The dependent relatives shall comply with the requirements of the Selective Service System, if applicable, in order to be accorded this benefit. In the event the member of the armed services removes his abode from North Carolina during an academic year, the dependent relative shall continue to be eligible for the in-State tuition rate during the remainder of that academic year.
- (d) The burden of proving entitlement to the benefit of this section shall lie with the applicant therefor.
- (e) A person charged less than the <u>out of State out-of-state</u> tuition rate solely by reason of this section shall not, during the period of receiving that benefit, qualify for or be the basis of conferring the <u>benefits benefit</u> of G.S. 116-143.1(g), (h), (i), (j), (k), or (1)."

SECTION 2. This act becomes effective July 1, 2003.

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
