AN ACT TO AMEND THE CHARTER OF THE CITY OF GREENSBORO TO GIVE
THE CITY MANAGER GREATER AUTHORITY TO APPROVE CERTAIN
CONTRACTS.

5 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

6 **SECTION 1.** Section 4.111 of the Charter of the City of Greensboro, being 7 Chapter 1137 of the 1959 Session Laws, as amended, reads as rewritten:

8 "Sec. 4.111. Contract Procedures.

9 All contracts, except as otherwise provided for in this charter, shall be authorized 10 and approved by the council and reduced to writing in order to be binding upon the city. 11 All contracts and all ordinances or resolutions authorizing the same shall be drawn by 12 the city attorney or shall be approved by him before authorization by the council. A 13 contract for the purchase of apparatus, supplies, materials or equipment or a contract for 14 the performance of services may be approved, awarded and executed by the city manager on behalf o the city provided that the city council shall have approved a 15 16 sufficient appropriation in the annual budget for the current fiscal year. A contract for 17 construction or demolition may be approved, awarded and executed by the city manager on behalf of the city when the amount of such contract does not exceed one hundred 18 thousand dollars (\$100,000.00) three hundred thousand dollars (\$300,000); provided 19 20 that the city council shall have approved a sufficient appropriation in the annual budget for the current fiscal year for the general purposes specified under the contract. Before 21 22 any such contract is awarded, the city manager shall comply with all other requirements 23 set forth in G.S. 143-129, and G.S. 143-131, and said contract shall be subject to the 24 approval of the city attorney. Any person aggrieved by an award made pursuant to this 25 section may appeal to the city council by filing notice thereof with the city clerk 26 immediately following a decision granting such award."

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SECTION 2. This act is effective when it becomes law.
