## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED <br> AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE APPALACHIAN STATE UNIVERSITY TO REGULATE PARKING ON CERTAIN STREETS. <br> The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: <br> SECTION 1. G.S. 116-44.5(2) reads as rewritten: <br> "§ 116-44.5. Special provisions applicable to identified constituent institutions of the University of North Carolina. <br> In addition to the powers granted by G.S. 116-44.4, the board of trustees of each of the constituent institutions enumerated hereinafter shall have the additional powers prescribed: <br> (2) The Board of Trustees of Appalachian State University may by ordinance prohibit, regulate, and limit the parking of motor vehicles on those portions of the following public streets in the Town of Boone where parking is not prohibited by an ordinance of the Town of Boone: <br> a. Faculty-Rivers Street, between U.S. 221-U.S. 321 (Hardin Street) and Water Street; <br> b. Stadium Drive, between Faculty-Rivers Street and Fernclift Hemlock Drive; <br> c. College Street, between U.S. 421-U.S. 321 (King Street) and Locust Street;to the extent that it is bounded on both sides by the university campus; <br> d. Appalachian Street, between Locust Street and Howard Street; <br> e. Brown Street, between Locust Street and Howard Street.Street; <br> f. Hill Street, only on the half of Hill Street bounded by the university campus; <br> g. Stansberry Circle, from Holmes Drive to the end of Stansberry Circle;

h. Locust Street, from U.S. 221-U.S. 321 (Hardin Street) to the end of Locust Street; and
i. Dale Street, from State Farm Road to the end of Dale Street." SECTION 2. This act is effective when it becomes law.
