4	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
5	SECTION 1. G.S. 36A-125.4(b) reads as rewritten:
6	"(b) Where the beneficiaries of an irrevocable trust seek to compel a termination
7	of the trust or modify it in a manner that affects its continuance according to its terms,
8	and if the continuance of the trust is necessary to carry out a material purpose of the
9	trust, or where the beneficiaries seek to compel a modification of the trust in a manner
10	that is inconsistent with its material purpose, the trust cannot be modified or terminated
11	unless the court in its discretion determines that the reason for modifying or terminating
12	the trust under the circumstances substantially outweighs the interest in accomplishing a
13	material purpose of the trust."
14	SECTION 2. G.S. 36A-125.11 reads as rewritten:
15	"§ 36A-125.11. Procedure.
16	(a) A proceeding under this Article may be brought under the Uniform
17	Declaratory Judgment Act, Article 26 of Chapter 1 of the General Statutes, the
18	provisions of which shall apply to that proceeding to the extent not inconsistent with
19	this Article.
20	(b) A proceeding under this Article to approve or disapprove a proposed
21	modification or termination under the provisions of G.S. 36A-125.3, 36A-125.4,
22	36A-125.6(a), and 36A-125.7 may be commenced by a trustee or beneficiary. The
23	trustee shall be a necessary party to all proceedings under this Article commenced by a
24	beneficiary."
25	SECTION 3. This act is effective when it becomes law.

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
