G.S. 14-33(c) is amended by adding a new subdivision to read: "(c) Unless the conduct is covered under some other provision of law providing greater punishment, any person who commits any assault, assault and battery, or affray is guilty of a Class A1 misdemeanor if, in the course of the assault, assault and battery, or affray, he or she:

The following definitions shall apply in this subdivision: a. "In the presence of a minor" means:

25 26	SECTION 2. This act becomes effective December 1, 2003, and applies to offenses committed on or after that date.
