The Institute for Public Health, University of North Carolina at 14 Chapel Hill School of Public Health. 15 (3) The Governor shall appoint three members who represent patient 16 advocacy and consumer organizations and are not practicing attorneys. **SECTION 1.(c)** Duties. – The Commission shall study current activities 17 18 being conducted by hospitals and other health care providers to address patient safety in 19 the provision of health care in this State and shall determine the actions that should be 20 taken, including legislative actions and collaboration among agencies and other 21 individuals and entities, to substantially enhance and promote patient safety. **SECTION 1.(d)** Reports. – The Commission shall submit a final written 22 23 report of its findings and recommendations to the General Assembly not later than the 24 convening of the 2007 General Assembly. The Commission may submit a progress report to the 2006 Regular Session of the 2005 General Assembly upon its convening. 25 The reports shall also include legislative proposals necessary to implement the 26 27 Commission's recommendations and an analysis of the fiscal impact of each

SECTION 1.(e) Expenses of Members. – Members of the Commission shall be paid per diem, subsistence, and travel expenses as follows:

- (2) Commission members who are officials or employees of the State or local government agencies shall be paid in accordance with G.S. 138-6.
- (3) All other Commission members shall be paid in accordance with G.S. 138-5.

SECTION 1.(f) Cochairs; Meetings. – The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint a cochair, and the President Pro Tempore of the Senate shall appoint a cochair for the Commission from their respective appointees. The Commission shall meet upon the call of the chairs. A majority of the Commission members shall constitute a quorum. The Commission may meet during a regular or special session of the General Assembly, subject to the approval of the President Pro Tempore of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives.
