6	"(a) Before	e acting on the application, the issuing official may examine on oath the

8	other than that contained in the affidavit may not be considered by the issuing official in			
9	-	ether probable cause exists for the issuance of the warrant unless the		
10		ther recorded or contemporaneously summarized in the record or on the		
11		ant by the issuing official. The information must be shown by one or		
12	more of the follo			
13	<u>(1)</u>	<u>Affidavit; or</u>		
14	<u>(2)</u>	Oral testimony under oath or affirmation before the issuing official; or		
15	<u>(3)</u>	Oral testimony under oath or affirmation presented by a sworn law		
16		enforcement officer to the issuing official by means of an audio and		
17		video transmission in which both parties can see and hear each other.		
18		Prior to the use of audio and video transmission pursuant to this		
19		subdivision, the procedures and type of equipment for audio and video		
20		transmission shall be submitted to the Administrative Office of the		
21		Courts by the senior regular resident superior court judge and the chief		
22		district court judge for a judicial district or set of districts and		
23		approved by the Administrative Office of the Courts."
