6	<u>c.</u> <u>The retail permit holder shall be solely liable for any violations</u>
7	of law occurring in connection with the wine tasting.
8	The Commission shall adopt rules to assure that the tastings are limited
9	to samplings and not a subterfuge for the unlawful sale or distribution
10	of wine, and that the tastings are not used by industry members for
11	unlawful inducements to retail permit holders, and do not violate
12	existing rules. Except for purposes of this subsection, the holder of a
13	wine-tasting permit shall not be construed to hold a permit for the
14	on-premises sale or consumption of alcoholic beverages. Any food
15	business is eligible for a wine-tasting permit."
16	SECTION 2. This act is effective when it becomes law.
