SECTION 10. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Judicial 40 Department the sum of eighty-one thousand eight hundred two dollars (\$81,802) for the 41 42 2005-2006 fiscal year and the sum of three hundred twelve thousand eight hundred eighty-three dollars (\$312,883) for the 2005-2006 fiscal year to implement the 43 44 provisions of this act.

SECTION 11. Sections 1 and 2 of this act become effective December 1, 1 2005, or the date upon which Section 1 of this act is approved under section 5 of the 2 3 Voting Rights Act of 1965, whichever is later. Sections 3 through 5 of this act become 4 effective December 1, 2005, or the date upon which Section 3 of this act is approved under section 5 of the Voting Rights Act of 1965, whichever is later. Sections 6 through 5 6 9 of this act become effective January 1, 2007, or the date upon which Section 6 of this act is approved under section 5 of the Voting Rights Act of 1965, whichever is later, but 7 the district attorneys for Prosecutorial Districts 20A and 20B shall be elected in the 8 9 2006 general election. The remainder of this act becomes effective December 1, 2005.
