2	AN ACT ESTABLISHING THE CAUSES AND REMEDIES OF THE MINORITY
3	INCARCERATION STUDY COMMISSION AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS
4	FOR THE COMMISSION.
5	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
6	SECTION 1.(a) There is created the Causes and Remedies of Minority
7	Incarceration Study Commission ("Commission"). The Commission shall consist of 15
8	members appointed as follows:
9	(1) Five members appointed by the Governor.
10	(2) Five members of the House of Representatives appointed by the
11	Speaker of the House.
12	(3) Five members of the Senate appointed by the President Pro Tempore
13	of the Senate.
14	SECTION 1.(b) The Commission shall study the causes of and remedies for
15	the disparity of incarceration for African-Americans and Hispanics in this State as
16	compared to members of other ethnic groups.
17	SECTION 2.(a) The Speaker of the House of Representatives and the
18	President Pro Tempore of the Senate shall each appoint a cochair for the Commission.
19	The Commission may contract for consultant services as provided by G.S. 120-32.02.
20	Upon approval of the Legislative Services Commission, the Legislative Services Officer
21	shall assign professional and clerical staff to assist in the work of the Commission.
22	Clerical staff shall be furnished to the Commission through the offices of the House of
23	Representatives and Senate Supervisors of Clerks. The Commission may meet in the
24	Legislative Building or the Legislative Office Building upon the approval of the
25	Legislative Services Commission. The Commission, while in discharge of official
26	duties, may exercise all the powers provided under the provisions of G.S. 120-19
27	through G.S. 120-19.4, including the power to request all officers, agents, agencies, and
28	departments of the State to provide any information, data, or documents within their
29	possession, ascertainable from their records, or otherwise available to them, and the

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power to subpoena witnesses. The procedure for issuing a subpoena shall be the same 1 procedure as provided in G.S. 120-19.2 for a joint committee of the House and Senate. 2 3 Members of the Commission shall receive per diem, subsistence, and travel allowances 4 at the rate established in G.S. 120-3.1. The appointing authority shall fill vacancies. SECTION 2.(b) The Commission shall submit a final report to the 2006 5 6 Regular Session of the 2005 General Assembly and shall terminate upon filing its final 7 report. 8 **SECTION 3.** There is appropriated from the General Fund to the General 9 Assembly the sum of twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) for the 2005-2006 fiscal 10 year for the costs of the work of the Study Commission created in Section 1 of this act. SECTION 4. This act becomes effective July 1, 2005. 11
