4	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:			
5		<b>ECTION 1.</b> G.S. 20-79.4(b)(27b) reads as rewritten:		
6 7	"(b) Ty plates:	ypes. – The Division shall issue the following types of special registration		
8	plates.			
9	(2	7b) Military Wartime Veteran. – Issuable to either a member or veteran of		
10	× ×	the armed services of the United States who served during a period of		
11	war. If the person is a veteran of the armed services, then the veteran			
12	must be separated from the armed services under honorable conditions.			
13		The plate shall bear a word or phrase identifying the period of war and		
14	a replica of the campaign badge or medal awarded for that war. Except			
15		for World War II and Korean Conflict plates, the Division may not		
16		issue a plate authorized by this subdivision unless it receives at least		
17 18		300 applications for that plate. A "period of war" is any of the following:		
18 19		following: a. World War I, meaning the period beginning April 16, 1917, and		
20		ending November 11, 1918.		
21		b. World War II, meaning the period beginning December 7,		
22		1941, and ending December 31, 1946.		
23		c. The Korean Conflict, meaning the period beginning June 27,		
24		1950, and ending January 31, 1955.		
25		d. The Vietnam Era, meaning the period beginning August 5,		
26		1964, and ending May 7, 1975.		
27		e. Desert Storm, meaning the period beginning August 2, 1990,		
28		and ending April 11, 1991.
