A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 2 AN ACT TO MAKE MODIFY THE SCOPE OF CERTAIN PROJECTS FUNDED BY 3 BONDS ISSUED FOR CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS FOR THE UNIVERSITY 4 OF NORTH CAROLINA AND TO REVISE THE ALLOCATION OF PROCEEDS 5 OF SPECIAL INDEBTEDNESS WITH RESPECT TO CERTAIN UNIVERSITY PROJECTS. 6 7 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: 8 SECTION 1.(a) Pursuant to Section 2(b) of S.L. 2000-3, the General Assembly finds that it is in the best interest of the State to respond to current 9 educational and research program requirements at North Carolina State University by 10 reducing the scope of "Williams Hall Laboratory Building-Comprehensive 11 The Renovation." from "Williams Hall Laboratory 12 unused funds Building-Comprehensive Renovation" should be transferred to the following projects 13 listed under the section entitled North Carolina State University: "Polk Hall Laboratory 14 Building-Comprehensive Renovation," "1911 Classroom Building-Comprehensive 15 Renovation," and "Park Shops-Comprehensive Renovation and Use Conversion for 16 General Academic Use."
