4 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

SECTION 1. G.S. 7A-10(c) reads as rewritten:

6 In lieu of merit and other increment raises paid to regular State employees, "(c) 7 the Chief Justice and each of the Associate Justices shall receive as longevity pay an 8 annual amount equal to four and eight-tenths percent (4.8%) of the annual salary set forth in the Current Operations Appropriations Act payable monthly after five years of 9 service, nine and six-tenths percent (9.6%) after 10 years of service, fourteen and 10 four-tenths percent (14.4%) after 15 years of service, and nineteen and two-tenths 11 percent (19.2%) after 20 years of service. service, and twenty-four percent (24%) after 12 25 years of service. "Service" means service as a justice or judge of the General Court 13 14 of Justice or as a member of the Utilities Commission. Service shall also mean service as a district attorney or as a clerk of superior court." 15

SECTION 2. G.S. 7A-18(b) reads as rewritten:

17 In lieu of merit and other increment raises paid to regular State employees, a "(b) judge of the Court of Appeals shall receive as longevity pay an annual amount equal to 18 19 four and eight-tenths percent (4.8%) of the annual salary set forth in the Current 20 Operations Appropriations Act payable monthly after five years of service, nine and 21 six-tenths percent (9.6%) after 10 years of service, fourteen and four-tenths percent 22 (14.4%) after 15 years of service, and nineteen and two-tenths percent (19.2%) after 20 23 years of service. service, and twenty-four percent (24%) after 25 years of service. Service shall mean service in 20 the elective position of a district attorney and shall not include service as a deputy or 21 acting district attorney. Service shall also mean service as a justice or judge of the 22 General Court of Justice, clerk of superior court, assistant district attorney, public 23 defender, appellate defender, or assistant public or appellate defender."

SECTION 5. G.S. 7A-144(b) reads as rewritten:

25 "(b) Notwithstanding merit, longevity and other increment raises paid to regular 26 State employees, a judge of the district court shall receive as longevity pay an annual 27 amount equal to four and eight-tenths percent (4.8%) of the annual salary set forth in the 28 Current Operations Appropriations Act payable monthly after five years of service, nine 29 and six-tenths percent (9.6%) after 10 years of service, fourteen and four-tenths percent 30 (14.4%) after 15 years of service, and nineteen and two-tenths percent (19.2%) after 20 31 years of service. service, and twenty-four percent (24%) after 25 years of service. 32 "Service" means service as a justice or judge of the General Court of Justice or as a 33 member of the Utilities Commission or as director or assistant director of the 34 Administrative Office of the Courts. Service shall also mean service as a district 35 attorney or as a clerk of superior court."
