5	SECTION 1. Article 2 of Chapter 126 of the General Statutes is amended by
6	adding a new subsection to read:
7	"§ 126-8.6. Bereavement leave.
8	State employees shall receive three days of paid leave for bereavement upon the
9	death of an immediate family member. As used in this section, "immediate family
10	member" refers to (i) the employee's spouse, child, parent, sibling, grandparent, and
11	grandchild, and any of the corresponding step, half, or in-law relationships, or (ii) any
12	person living within the employee's home for whom the employee may claim a
13	deduction under section 151 of the Internal Revenue Code.
14	Employees shall not be permitted to accumulate bereavement leave or to use
15	bereavement leave for creditable service toward retirement.
16	The Office of State Personnel shall adopt rules to implement the provisions of this
17	section."
18	SECTION 2. Article 23 of Chapter 115C of the General Statutes is amended
19	by adding a new section to read:
20	" <u>§ 115C-336.2. Bereavement leave.</u>
21	Public school employees shall receive three days of paid leave for bereavement upon
22	the death of an immediate family member. As used in this section, "immediate family
23	member" refers to (i) the employee's spouse, child, parent, sibling, grandparent, and
24	grandchild, and any of the corresponding step, half, or in-law relationships, or (ii) any
25	person living within the employee's home for whom the employee may claim a
26	deduction under section 151 of the Internal Revenue Code.
