3	The General As	sembly of North Carolina enacts:
4	SEC'	TION 1. Article 68 of Chapter 143 of the General Statutes is amended
5	by adding a nev	v section to read:

7	(a) Creat	tion The Boxing Advisory Commission is created within the
8		Crime Control and Public Safety to advise the Alcohol Law Enforcement
9	Division of the	e Department of Crime Control and Public Safety concerning matters
10	regulated by thi	is Article. The Commission shall consist of six voting members and two
11	nonvoting advis	sory members. All the members shall be residents of North Carolina. The
12	members shall b	be appointed as follows:
13	<u>(1)</u>	One voting member shall be appointed by the Governor for an initial
14		term of two years.
15	<u>(2)</u>	One voting member shall be appointed by the President Pro Tempore
16		of the Senate for an initial term of three years.
17	<u>(3)</u>	One voting member shall be appointed by the Speaker of the House of
18		Representatives for an initial term of three years.
19	<u>(4)</u>	Two voting members shall be appointed by the Secretary of Crime
20		Control and Public Safety. One shall serve for an initial term of three
21		years, and the other shall serve for an initial term of two years.
22	<u>(5)</u>	One member shall be appointed by the Tribal Council of the Eastern
23		Band of the Cherokee for an initial term of three years.
24	<u>(6)</u>	One nonvoting advisory member shall be appointed by the Speaker of
25		the House of Representatives for an initial term of one year, from
26		nominations made by the North Carolina Medical Society, which shall
27		nominate two licensed physicians for the position.
28	<u>(7)</u>	One nonvoting advisory member shall be appointed by the President
29		Pro Tempore of the Senate for an initial term of one year, from

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1	nominations made by the North Carolina Medical Society, which shall
2	nominate two licensed physicians for the position.
3	Notwithstanding the schedule above in subdivisions (1), (4), (6), and (7) of this
4	subsection, if any former member of the North Carolina Boxing Commission is
5	appointed to the initial membership, that person shall serve an initial term of three years.
6	The member appointed pursuant to subdivision (5) of this subsection may serve on the
7	Commission only if an agreement exists and remains in effect between the Tribal
8	Council of the Eastern Band of the Cherokee and the Commission authorizing the
9	Commission to regulate professional boxing matches within the Cherokee Indian
10	Reservation as provided by the Professional Boxing Safety Act of 1996.
11	The two nonvoting advisory members appointed pursuant to subdivisions (6) and (7)
12	of this subsection shall advise the Commission and the Division on matters concerning
13	the health and physical condition of boxers and health issues relating to the conduct of
14	exhibitions and boxing matches. They may prepare and submit to the Commission for
15	its consideration and to the Division for its approval any rules that in their judgment will
16	safeguard the physical welfare of all participants engaged in boxing.
17	Terms for all members of the Commission except for the initial appointments shall
18	be for three years.
19	The Secretary of Crime Control and Public Safety shall designate which member of
20	the Commission is to serve as chair. A member of the Commission may be removed
21	from office by the Secretary of Crime Control and Public Safety for cause. Each
22	member, before entering upon the duties of a member, shall take and subscribe an oath
23	to perform the duties of the office faithfully, impartially, and justly to the best of the
24	member's ability. A record of these oaths shall be filed in the Department of Crime
25	Control and Public Safety.
26	(b) Vacancies. – Members shall serve until their successors are appointed and
27	have been qualified. Any vacancy in the membership of the Commission shall be filled
28	in the same manner as the original appointment. A vacancy in the membership of the
29	Commission other than by expiration of term shall be filled for the unexpired term only.
30	(c) <u>Meetings. – Meetings of the Commission shall be called by the chair or by</u>
31	any two members of the Commission, and meetings shall be held at least quarterly. Any
32	three voting members of the Commission shall constitute a quorum at any meeting.
33	Action may be taken and motions and resolutions adopted by the Commission at any
34	meeting by the affirmative vote of a majority of the members of the Commission
35	present at a meeting at which a quorum exists.
36	(d) <u>Review Authority of the Commission. – The Commission shall review</u>
37	existing rules adopted under this Article and shall from time to time make
38	recommendations to the Division for changes or addition to such rules. Any proposals
39	for change, amendment, addition, or deletion to those rules shall be submitted by the
40	Division to the Commission for its comments prior to approval.
41	(e) <u>Compensation. – None of the members of the Commission shall receive</u>
42	compensation for serving on the Commission. However, members of the Commission
43	may be reimbursed for their expenses in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 138
44	of the General Statutes.

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- (f) Staff Assistance. The Secretary of Crime Control and Public Safety shall
 provide staff assistance to the Commission.
 (g) Initial appointments to the Commission under this section shall be for terms
- 4 <u>commencing July 1, 2007.</u>"

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SECTION 2. This act becomes effective July 1, 2007.
