INTRODUCTION AND TITLE OF ACT 8 9 **INTRODUCTION** 10 **SECTION 1.1.** The appropriations made in this act are for maximum amounts necessary to provide the services and accomplish the purposes described in the 11 12 budget. Savings shall be effected where the total amounts appropriated are not required 13 to perform these services and accomplish these purposes, and savings shall revert to the 14 appropriate fund at the end of each fiscal year as allowed by the State Budget Act unless 15 otherwise provided by this act or other law. 16 17 **TITLE OF ACT** 18 **SECTION 1.2.** This act shall be known as the "Current Operations and 19 Capital Improvements Appropriations Act of 2007." 20 21 PART II. 35	SECTION 6.2. Except for statutory changes or other provisions that clearly
36	indicate an intention to have effects beyond the 2007-2009 fiscal biennium, the textual
37	provisions of this act apply only to funds appropriated for, and activities occurring
38	during, the 2007-2009 fiscal biennium.

41	SECTION 6.3. The headings to the parts and sections of this act are a
42	convenience to the reader and are for reference only. The headings do not expand,
43	limit, or define the text of this act, except for effective dates referring to a part.
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1 SEVERABILITY CLAUSE

2 **SECTION 6.4.** If any section or provision of this act is declared 3 unconstitutional or invalid by the courts, it does not affect the validity of this act as a 4 whole or any part other than the part so declared to be unconstitutional or invalid.

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EFFECTIVE DATE

7 **SECTION 6.5.** Except as otherwise provided, this act becomes effective 8 July 1, 2007.
